The session was attended by local councillors from Matlosana Local Municipality, Maguassie Hills Local Municipality, JB Marks Local Municipality, and senior managers from both the district and local municipalities. Also in attendance was the South African Local Government Association (SALGA), with its Chief Operating Officer, Mr Lance Joel, delivering a powerful and informative presentation on the Local Government Legislative Framework. The event was spearheaded by the Executive Mayor, Cllr Nikiwe Num, who emphasized the significance of reviewing the foundational White Paper on Local Government to strengthen municipal performance and community development. The session was opened by the Speaker of the District Municipality, Cllr Xolile Nxozana who highlighted the purpose of the engagement, reinforcing the municipality's commitment to accountable, developmental, and people-centered governance.

"Local government is the closest sphere to our people, and it must reflect their voices, serve their needs, and promote their dignity," said Cllr Num. Key highlights of the session included:
